The Georgia Mineral Society, Inc. is a very active society. We hold several meetings each month, field trips, an annual Gem and Mineral Show, picnics, parties, and much more. When you become a GMS member you have a wide variety of activities to choose from:

General Meeting

The general meeting is at 7:30 p.m. on the first Monday of the month, whenever possible, (except for Monday holidays and the June picnic). The Tips and Trips and the website publish updated meeting times, places and dates. Special programs include the June Picnic and Auction for members, a banquet in October to induct new officers, and a holiday party in December. At the remaining general meetings, a guest speaker presents a program on one of the many aspects of our hobby followed by a brief business meeting and door prizes. Refreshments are served after each meeting.

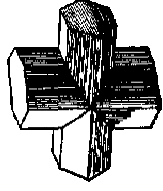
Field Trips

GMS hosts field trips at least once a month. Many months include a Georgia Mineral Society field trip, trips with other clubs, and trips offered through the Southeast Federation DMC. Field trip sites cover the southeast region of the United States.

Fossil Section Meeting

The Fossil Section meetings are scheduled by the section and meeting times and locations are published on the website and in the Tips and Trips. Show and tell discussions may cover fossils from local or worldwide sites. These meetings are excellent for members who wish to expand their fossil knowledge.

Gem Section

The Gem Section meets the last Monday of the month at the home of one of our members. Meetings are announced in the Tips and Trips and on the website. The current topics cover an in-depth study of gemology.

Junior Section Meeting

The Junior Section, comprised of our younger members, under eighteen, enjoys a special opportunity for learning and fun. Field trips suited for juniors are scheduled alternating months and may incorporate the meeting with the field trip.

Micromount Section Meeting

The Micromount Section meetings are scheduled by the section and meeting times and locations are posted on the website and in the newsletter. The meetings present the art and science of micro-mounting. Most often, the microscopic crystals show their perfect form.

Mineral Section Meeting

The Mineral Section meets bi-monthly at 7:30 p.m. on the third Tuesday of the month, whenever possible. Meeting times and locations are published on the website and in the newsletter. The meeting is a more focused discussion of minerals, mineralogy of rocks, care and collection of minerals, and more.
